Our Impact

Since 2011, CKA has been building a movement. We began as an all-volunteer group of Korean American leaders in SF, DC, and LA who wanted to build a national organization to strengthen the voice, visibility, and influence of our community. Today, CKA has five staff members, 230 members who are influential leaders in their fields, and a global network of partner organizations and supporters. In 2018, CKA's National Summit & Gala in Washington, DC attracted over 630 people and showcased the groundbreaking partnerships with African American and Jewish American communities to promote multicultural dialogue and education. It featured congressional leaders and government officials, including Representative Andy Kim, the only Korean American currently serving in Congress.
